The Phi Sigma Kappa Foundation, Inc. (Foundation) was established in 1947 as the arm of the Fraternity that can receive tax deductible contributions as a qualified 501(c)(3) dedicated to funding the educational programs of the Grand Chapter. Any Phi Sig who has attended a regional conclave, Shonk Leadership School, Zillgitt Leadership Institute, received a national scholarship, or lived in a chapter house whose alumni raised tax deductible funds to remodel or build educational spaces in the house has been enriched by the work of the Foundation. The Delta Triton Housing Fund is coming to a close as they have raised over one million dollars through the Foundation over the last two years. Additionally, the Foundation is also continuing to work with the Grand Chapter to create the Albert D. Shonk Jr. Archives and Educational Center at our International Headquarters to store, display, and educate visitors about the rich history of Phi Sigma Kappa and Phi Sigma Epsilon.

Following the vision of the Grand Chapter to enrich the undergraduate experience, expand strategically on campuses across the country with emphasis on schools where Phi Sig once had a chapter, and engaging with alumni and volunteers to foster support for a wide range of educational programming for our undergraduates, the Foundation is proud to play its part in achieving these goals. Each day we work with alumni across the country to make Phi Sig an even greater Fraternity with a positive impact on our members and society.

FISCAL YEAR 2017-18 GIFT IMPACT:

LEADERSHIP EDUCATION, PROGRAMMING & ACHIEVEMENTS

Albert D. Shonk Undergraduate Leadership School

Leadership training in chapter management, as well as personal development, is provided in annual leadership schools. Named for Court of Honor member and past Phi Sigma Kappa Foundation President Albert D. Shonk, Jr., the Shonk Undergraduate Leadership School is held every year either in conjunction with the General Convention, or as its own educational session. This learning opportunity brings together undergraduates and officers for courses covering their duties as fraternity leaders and provides a clearinghouse for new ideas on chapter and college life.

At this year's Shonk Undergraduate Leadership School more than 325 brothers have come from all around the country to discuss various topics. This year's programming is focused around role specific tracks and education. Chapters were asked to send their Presidents, Inductors and Recruitment Chairs to this summer's event with a goal of focused and concentrated effort on these critical leaders. A few of the other topics that were covered by our keynote and guest speakers included risk management, recruitment, ritual, sexual assault prevention, and mental health.

Robert M. Zillgitt Leadership Institute

"Leadership for Life" is the mantra of the Robert M. Zillgitt Leadership Institute. The Institute provides education that benefits participants in all aspects of their lives, from fraternity to family, from college to the professional world. As cornerstones, the Zillgitt Leadership Institute explores personal development and awareness, introduces concepts of citizenship and community, and defines elements of leadership.

This year the Robert M. Zillgitt Leadership Institute was held in conjunction with Shonk Leadership School and had 17 elite participants.

Regional Conclaves

Several regional educational conclaves are held each winter in order to expose a large number of undergraduate members to a broad assortment of educational topics ranging from chapter operations and leadership to areas of personal growth. Every chapter and colony sends six or more delegates to the conclave designated for its region of the country. Held on various weekends throughout January and February, expert volunteer officers and members of the International Headquarters staff facilitate the educational sessions.

This past year Phi Sigs had 500 attendees between the eight regional conclaves and were training on a variety of topics affecting campuses and institutions across the country. They also were able to learn how to translate the skills and lessons that they will learn as Chapter Officers in their professional career after college.

Good Samaritan Fund

The purpose of the Good Samaritan Fund is to provide financial support to chapters or colonies in need in order for them to be able to send delegates to the conclaves and leadership schools the Fraternity offers.

This past year 14 chapters requested and received financial support totaling \$8,630.00 through these funds.

Scholarships & Grants

The Phi Sigma Kappa Fraternity provided several scholarships, fellowships and educational grants during the 2017-2018 academic year. Scholarship recipients are carefully chosen based upon their academic success, commitment to the ideals of Phi Sigma Kappa and service to their campus, community, and Fraternity. Undergraduate and graduate members are eligible for scholarships and grants.

For the 2017-2018 academic year a total of \$54,580 in scholarships were awarded through a combination of nationally granted funds and individual chapter awards managed by the Foundation.

GreekLifeEdu – Discusses Sexual Assault, Alcohol, Drug, and Hazing Education

Phi Sigma Kappa is committed to providing ongoing education to our undergraduate members covering the health implications of alcohol and drug use as well as training so our members will be equipped to make appropriate personal and social decisions. GreekLifeEdu provides professionally developed educational material covering these topics. Licensing of the course materials is supported by grants from the Phi Sigma Kappa Foundation.

Over the course of the 2017-2018 academic year, 1,312 undergraduates participated in GreekLifeEdu online courses.

Albert D. Shonk Jr. Archives and Educational Center

The Foundation is working with the Grand Chapter to raise the capital to create a museum and education center at the headquarters building that will be known as the Albert D. Shonk Jr. Archives and Educational Center. This facility will be home for Phi Sig's history and memorabilia. It will be an active education center welcoming Phi Sig and others to learn of the rich history of Phi Sigma Kappa and Phi Sigma Epsilon. To date, \$386,689.00 has been raised for the project through the generous donations and pledges of those across the country.

Chapter House Acquisition & Educational Space Building Programs

In support of the Chapter at Purdue: The Foundation has accepted tax deductible gifts (*now over \$1 million raised*) for the construction of a new chapter house. The majority of the Foundation funds have been disbursed for educational space related construction costs to Delta Triton over the last year.

Leadership Advisor Sponsorship

Last year, after receiving a request for financial support from a group of alumni brothers traveling to colonies and chapters in the southeast to provide educational support, the Foundation worked with the Grand Chapter to create the Advisers Excellence Fund. This fund will provide grants to subsidize travel expenses for Grand Chapter recognized volunteer alumni engaged in visiting chapters and colonies and providing educational instruction to our undergraduates. Chapter operations, recruitment, officer development, chapter house management, financial management, social and interpersonal development, and fraternity history are all areas mentoring volunteer alumni provide the support to our undergraduates. This fund will support their invaluable efforts. This year there were 20 alumni volunteer spots opened up with a majority of their fees being covered by these funds.

FY2018 FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS:

The Foundation began the fiscal year ended June 30, 2018, with a new Executive Director / Chief Operating Officer, Nick Zuniga. The COO assessed the situation of the Foundation and formed a strategic staffing plan which called for Joe Kern to be elevated to the Director of Advancement and Greg DalSanto to fill the position of Development Officer. Under the new operating structure and with the staffing resources needed the Foundation executed its first ever National Day of Giving in March 2018 with huge success. The Foundation's unrestricted revenue for fiscal 2018 increased to \$486,697 from \$326,500 in the prior year. This was a 67% improvement over fiscal 2017.

The 2018 fiscal year saw total donor support and other revenue of \$1,036,789 versus \$977,511 in FY2017. \$550,092 of the FY2018 revenue was in the form of restricted gifts in support of specific chapters, projects, and educational programs. This compares with \$651,011 in restricted gifts received in FY2017.

Included in revenue numbers are earnings from the Foundation's investments in marketable securities and other liquid instruments which provided \$50,295 in funding from a pool of diversified investible assets of \$893,457. This implies a 5.6% return on investments. Total cash on hand and marketable securities held by the Foundation as of June 30, 2018 were \$1,147,205. This excess net restricted funds of \$1,019,335 as of June 30, 2018 by \$127,870

The financial statements of the Foundation for fiscal 2018 will undergo an audit in the fall of 2018. Accordingly, the numbers presented above should be considered preliminary. However, management of the Foundation does not expect any material adjustments to these figures as a result of the audit.

THE YEAR AHEAD – MOVING FORWARD:

As we begin fiscal 2018 the Foundation looks forward to a promising future as Phi Sigma Kappa's volunteer leaders and professional staff engage with alumni and undergraduate brothers developing and nurturing a culture of support within our Fraternity. We are committed to increasing our fundraising and providing Phi Sig undergraduate brothers the educational programming and volunteer and professional support they need to help them become men who will make a positive difference in our society.

- Our stakeholders have seen an improvement in the quality and frequency of our direct mail pieces. We will continue this effort.
- Phi Sigs have seen the Signet upgraded, and reformatted. It is now many more pages than in years past and it is sent out to a broader distribution. The Signet will remain a cornerstone of our brotherhood.
- Alumni receptions and other alumni centered events are being retooled with less emphasis on immediate fundraising and more focus on education and creating a culture of support. The Fraternity will now execute them with support from the Foundation.
- The Foundation will continue to seek out alumni brothers to strategically add trustees and associate trustees that can support the goals of the Foundation and Fraternity while increasing representation from chapters and geographies across the country.
- Our professional staff will expand the "National Day of Giving" for Phi Sig and engage with more alumni during this fundraising event.
- We will complete the capital campaign in support of the Albert D. Shonk Jr. Archives and Educational Center and see this facility completed before the next general convention.

All of this is possible because of the generous support of brothers, families, and friends that see the value Phi Sig brings to young college men and alumni members all the days of their lives.

We thank each of our donors this past year. Whether you are a first-time supporter or a steadfast alumnus that has supported Phi Sig year after year. Your generosity makes all the difference to the work of Phi Sig. We promise to use your gifts for the betterment of our undergraduate brothers.

It is through your effort and support that we will help them to realize their full potential as men of character committed to living by the Golden Rule and treating all others and themselves with respect and dignity. We will help to nurture their love of scholarship and desire for lifelong learning all while fostering a genuine appreciation for the Brotherhood and its members.
